- * Credits transferred from Walt Disney World College Program shall be transferred according to the guidelines set forth by Western.
- *Com 4990 (not experiential learning or practicum) is set up with the School of Communication faculty adviser prior to departure to Walt Disney World. Students desiring to earn Com 4990 credit will register for WMU course credit during the time they are at Walt Disney World, and will complete their internship according to established School of Communication guidelines.
- *Students may transfer up to 15 credit hours with a grade of “C” or better toward a Communication or Journalism major
- *Students may transfer up to 9 credit hours with a grade of “C” or better toward a Communication or Journalism minor
- *Students may declare either one major or one minor in the School of Communication
- *Additional approved credit hours beyond these hours **may** count toward general electives toward graduation
- *Baccalaureate writing courses must be taken at Western Michigan University, unless approved by the School of Communication Faculty Advisor
- *Up to 6 total hours in any combination of 3980/4990 may be used toward a major and up to 3 hours of 3980/4990 may be used toward a minor
- *Students may take up to 6 hours each of COM 3050 & COM 4800 credit **provided the topics are different**
- *Courses approved as “Com credit” may be used as toward general electives toward graduation. They may also be used to fulfill a 1000-2000 level communication elective.
- *The School of Communication and its Undergraduate Advising Office make every effort to ensure accuracy and current information.
